Faiths for a Low Carbon Future



2019 ANNUAL REPORT

Footsteps' has had a very active year. The steering group is becoming increasingly challenged to coordinate and respond to the growing number of opportunities and requests to make faith-based climate action contributions.

The main events Footsteps held during the year started with the annual Tread Lightly Conference in November 2019 held at the Guru Nanak Gurdwara, in neighbouring Smethwick. Lizzie Nelson, from Faiths for the Climate Network spoke and the conference supported financially by GreenFaith, the global interfaith environmental charity. In February we held with the Climate Coalition a #ShowtheLove event at the Birmingham Central Mosque. Finally, our summer activity took the form of a successful walk and study visit to the Tyseley Energy Park that also built links with the local community and St Cyprians Church.

Our work with young people included having a base at the BCF's Faiths for Fun in March and providing a faith perspective at a young social entrepreneurs training evening in the Ladywood community hall. Work on developing a web-based version of Small Footsteps resources has been making progress.

In addition, Footsteps had a presence or spoken at a number of faith and environmental events which are listed in the Attachment. Events included: community iftars, Sikh Environment Day tree planting and local community events in Kings Heath and the Martineau Gardens.

Footsteps has increasingly been taking a faith voice into the Birmingham public and political arena. This culminated in May with presenting a letter to Birmingham City Council calling on the Council to declare a climate emergency. The letter was endorsed by the Birmingham Faith Leaders group and supported by 45 individual community faith leaders. As a result, Councillor Waseem Zaffar committed to Footsteps being represented on the Climate Emergency Task Force being established. A Footsteps report 'Birmingham Climate Emergency – The Role for Faith Communities' is about to be published.

The steering group endeavours to evaluate each event to better understand what works well. The attached list of Footsteps Events and Activities is based on the spreadsheet list used for planning and reviewing our work. Footsteps website carries reports on most events which attracts attention and favourable reactions.

Footsteps finances were in a sound position at the end of the year, with £1,466 of restricted funds for developing and disseminating Small Footsteps learning resources and £940 for general activities.

We are now entering a period of unprecedented concern and action on the climate. The activities of climate activists, many acting from conscience and faith, will become increasingly visible. During the coming year Footsteps will be doing all that it is able help faith communities work together and with others in addressing the enormous environmental and climate challenges we face.
