What's New in Healthcare

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2. Introduction

The Health Service Reforms resulting from the **Health & Social Care Act** came into being on 1st April 2013.

Essential principles:-

- 1. Be clinically led
- 2. Have greater patient and public involvement in decision making
- 3. Quality of care should be at the centre of all we do

3. NHS Reforms (simplified)

- PCTs (Primary Care Trusts) abolished.
- NHS England established
- Local CCGs (GP Clinical Commissioning Groups) commission services from NHS Trusts & in some cases from the 3rd & Private Sectors.
- **Provider Trusts** (Hospital & Community Services) work towards NHS Foundation Trust status
- -Public Health transferred to Local Authorities

4. NHS Reforms Simplified

- Local Health and Wellbeing Boards agree health and social care strategy, and facilitate joint working between NHS and Local Authorities
- **Healthwatch** England and Local Healthwatchs replace LINks
- Monitor has quality responsibility in addition to finance, efficiency, effectiveness, etc
- CQC (Care Quality Commission) responsible for care standards
- LA Overview & Scrutiny Committees continue

Implementation of Care Act April 2015

- National eligibility criteria
- Councils to offer loans to pay for residential care, repaid after death
- Carer's right to assessment
- Cap of £72,000 on care costs for over 65's
 April 2016
- Cap for younger people to be finalised

Overall theme – Partnership & Cooperation

Greater Manchester Integrated Health & Social Care

12 CCGs, 15 NHS Providers & 10 Local Authorities

Brings together health and social care budgets – combined sum of £6bn.

Plans for joint decision-making on integrated care to support physical, mental and social wellbeing

BVSC - Ageing Better Programme

- Main aim to reduce older age isolation
- Big Lottery funded -£6m
- 1 of 15 LAs approved
- Project plan approved
- Ageing Better networks
- Core group formed to steer includes faith org;
 asset based; CCG; Carers; Sparkbrook; LGBT.
